Martin Luther King Day (15th January) - this day commemorates the life and work of Dr King, who was a Baptist minister and a prominent leader in the American civil rights movement. People are encouraged to use the day to 'reflect on the principles of racial equality and non-violent social change espoused by Dr King'.

Cervical Cancer Awareness Month (all month) - raises awareness of cervical cancer, including warning signs, tests and treatment.



Holocaust Memorial Day (27th January) encourage remembrance in a world scarred
by genocide. This day remembers the six
million Jews murdered during the Holocaust,
alongside the millions of other people,
including disabled, LGBTQ+ and Romani
communities, amongst others, killed under
Nazi persecution and in more recent
genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and
Darfur. HMD is for everyone. Together we
bear witness for those who endured
genocide, and honour the survivors and all
those whose lives were changed beyond
recognition.







International Day of Education (24th January) is created to campaign for better education reforms and improve access to education for all.



The events of 2020, including the Black Lives Matter movement and the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on ethnic minority communities, has heightened public consciousness of race inequality.



International Day of Women and Girls in Science (11th February) - aims to promote the full and equal access and participation of females in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics fields.

World Hearing Day (3rd March) - aims to raise awareness on how to prevent deafness and hearing loss and promote ear and hearing care across the world. The 2023 theme highlights the importance of integrating ear and hearing care within primary care, as an essential component of universal health coverage.



Ramadan (begins 10th March) - The holiest month of the year where Muslims fast for 30 days, from sunrise to sunset.

For outpatients, avoid scheduling early morning appointments as many will be praying until the early hours of the morning, and avoid scheduling home visits near to sunset where they may be preparing to open their fast.

Some inpatients may still wish to fast even though they are exempt due to ill health and a review of medications may be required to take this into account.

Staff may wish to arrange their working day to accommodate timing of the fast and they may also require access to a prayer room.

International Transgender Day of Visibility
(31st March) - is a time to celebrate trans and
non-binary people and the courage it takes to
live openly and authentically, while also
raising awareness about the discrimination
that trans people continue to face in their
daily lives.

Spotlight on April

Eid al Fitr (9th April) - the exact date is determined by the moon sighting, which may vary according to the mosque that people attend.

Eid al Fitr is a two-day celebration marking the end of fasting, where 'Eid Mubarak' greetings are sent.

Avoid scheduling appointments on Eid and the day after and expect that inpatients may want to dress up and have vistors who bring special food. Staff may also request at least two days off.



Autism Awareness Day (2nd April) - Every year, World Autism Month includes celebrating World Autism Awareness Day.

The autism spectrum wheel is often used to help people to understand ASD. People may fall differently on the autism spectrum wheel day to day, and different people will experience this differently.

ASD can be characterised by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviours, focussed interests or hobbies, sensitivity to senses, such as light, sounds, taste and touch, and communication difficulties, and people living with ASD may need significant support in their daily lives, or none at all.







Passover (22nd - 30th April) - there will be Sabbath-like restrictions on the first two days, followed by few restrictions in the following days.

Lesbian Visibility Day (26th April) is meant to celebrate, recognise and bring visibility to lesbians. It's also about honouring a community that has historically been overlooked due to the intersection of being women and gay.

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History
Month (all month) - aims to educate
on the culture and lifestyle of these
communities. With the combination
of celebration, education and raising
awareness of the histories and
experiences of Gypsy, Roma and
Traveller people, the aim is to tackle
prejudice, challenge myths and
amplify the voices of these
communities.



LGBTQ+ Pride Month (all month) - celebrated annually in June to honour the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan, which was the tipping point in the creation of the Gay Liberation Movement in the United States and the consequent Pride events held across the globe.

In 1972, the UN General Assembly designated 5 June as World Environment Day (WED). WED has developed as a platform to raise awareness on the problems facing our environment such as air pollution, plastic pollution, illegal wildlife trade, sustainable consumption, sea-level increase, and food security, among others.



National Carers Week (8th June, date TBC) - is an annual campaign to raise awareness of caring, highlight the challenges unpaid carers face and recognition the contribution they make to families and communities throughout the UK. It also helps people to identify as carers and access much-need support.

Al-Hijra (Islamic New Year) (6th July) marks the migration of the Prophet
Muhammad and his followers from Mecca to
Medina. Avoid scheduling early morning
appointments as many people will spend the
night before in prayer. Be aware that
inpatients may want to fast on this day.

Ashura (16th July) - 10th day of the Islamic New Year. An optional 1 to 3-day fast recognising Moses's fasting in gratitude to God for liberation. Avoid scheduling appointments for Shia Muslims. Be aware that some inpatients may wish to pray and fast, and all genders may wish to dress in black.



International Non-Binary People's Day (14th July) - aims to raise awareness and educate around issues faced by non-binary people around the world.

The 14th July was chosen as it is precisely between International Women's Day and International Men's Day.



International Day of Friendship (30th July) - aims to encourage friendship between peoples, countries, cultures and individuals, to inspire peace efforts and build bridges between communities.

The Big Listen - Samaritans Awareness
Day (24th July) - celebrated on 24/7 to
highlight the constant nature of
Samaritan's work, this day aims to
raise awareness for all that the
Samaritan's do, including the services
they offer in local communities.



South Asian Heritage Month (18th July to 17th August) - seeks to commemorate, mark and celebrate South Asian cultures, histories and communities. It also aims to understand the diverse heritage and cultures that continue to link the UK with South Asia.

duration of the festival.



Spotlight on November

Diwali (1st November) - celebrates Guru Hargobind's, the sixth guru, release from prison, alongside 52 other princes. Traditionally, Diwali is a one day celebrating held in the Gurduwara, which involves lighting lamps - this is why Diwali is also known as 'the festival of lights'. Avoid scheduling appointments for outpatients where possible. Inpatients may have visitors, want to wear celebratory clothing and visit the Chapel to perform communal prayer. Staff may wish to have time off in the evening to visit the Gurduwara, and may also request time off the following weekend to participate in activities.



Armistice Day (11th November) - This is the date (in 1918) that World War One came to an end. Today, this anniversary is used to remember everyone who has died while at war, including World War Two, the Falklands War and ongoing conflicts across the world.

November) - TDoR is an
annual event on 20th
November that honours the
memory of the
transgender people whose
lives were lost in acts of
anti-transgender violence.

Disability History Month (16th November - 16th December) established in 2010. It is an annual event and is supported by a wide range of disability groups, unions and voluntary groups. This is an opportunity to celebrate the achievements and the contributions of people with disabilities and raise awareness of the challenges that they face.





International Men's Day (19th November) - highlights the worldwide positive contributions of men and boys. It is an occasion to celebrate boy's and men's lives and achievements. The broader and ultimate aim of the event is to promote basic awareness towards men's issues.



Christmas Day (25th December) - is when Western Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Often celebrated through prayer and song in Church and gifts are often giften, to represent the gifts Jesus received from the three Kings. Avoid scheduling outpatient appointments. Inpatients may have visitors, eat special foods and want to attend a service.

World AIDS Day (1st December) - shows support for people living with HIV and



to commemorate people who have

died.

International Day of People's with Disabilities (3rd December) - promotes an understanding of people with disability and encourage support for their dignity, rights and wellbeing.



Human Rights Day (10th December) - is celebrated to raise awareness of the inalienable right that everyone is entitled to be a human being regardless of race, colour, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.

International Day for the Abolition of Slavery (2nd December) - To reflect on the troubling issue of contemporary forms of slavery, such as human trafficking, sexual exploitation, child labour and forced labour, among others.

Hannukah (25th - 2nd January 2025) - is the festival of lights, involving the lighting of the Menorah (a nine candle candelabra) over eight nights.

There should be no specific impact on outpatient appointments, although evening appointments should be avoided. Inpatients may wish to light an electric candle or visit a menorah lighting, if one is available.
